PUBLIC COMMENTS

TAB 3 Public Comments

Steven Montiel, MRMPO Program Manager, informed the committee that the MRMPO received a letter from four State Representatives. MRMPO reached out to these State Representatives to schedule meetings to discuss the process of what the MPO does, who's eligible for Federal funding, and to discuss concerns or issues in the South Valley. The meetings will take place on May 22, 2023.

There were no other public comments for TIP or any other items at this time.

TAB 4

Reports**❖ Mid Region Metropolitan Planning Organization (MRMPO) Staff**

Kendra Montanari, MRMPO Transportation Planning & Technical Services Manager, informed the committee that the MPO is working on the agreements for the Safe Streets and Roads for All grant with FHWA/USDOT and putting together a scope of work with the consultant team for our Regional Transportation Safety Action Plan update. As part of this effort, we are hosting trainings. We just held a primer on the Safe Systems Approach with a speaker who is a national leader in the field of Safety Planning.

The next Training is hosted by UNM and is Planning and Designing for Pedestrian Safety May 23-25th in the MRCOG Board Room. Lastly, we are working on creating a steering committee of officials and a technical team of agency staff to lead this effort.

In addition, MPO technical services continue to be available for grant applications, comprehensive planning, and other assistance. We are constantly bolstering our datasets for forecasting, mapping, planning, and land use.

❖ Active Transportation Committee (ATC)

Tara Cok, MRMPO Active Transportation Planner, informed the committee that the consultant team for the nonmotorized count's expansion study has presented an Existing Conditions report that explores existing challenges to a consistent and comprehensive program. It highlights best practices and peer cities that may serve as models to grow the program. The Draft report is being updated based on feedback.

The next Active Transportation Committee meeting will be on Friday, April 21 from noon-1 pm at the MRCOG building (and on Zoom). The City of Albuquerque will be presenting on Bikeways & Trails Facilities Plan update.

❖ TPTG

Steven Montiel, MRMPO Program Manager informed the board that the action items on the agenda came recommended for approval from the Transportation Program Technical Group.

❖ Transportation Coordinating Committee (TCC)

Steven Montiel, MRMPO Program Manager informed the board that the action items on the agenda came recommended for approval from the Transportation Coordination Committee.

❖ Congestion Management Process Committee (CMP)

Willy Simon, MRMPO Transportation Planner, mentioned that the TAQA update is nearing completion. The consultants, the Timmons Group, mailed an external hard drive with all the congestion data on it, which was put on the servers. They also sent the application which is being hosted on the servers and it will draw from the data received to give users downloadable congestion data.

❖ **Land Use & Transportation Integration Committee (LUTI)**

Peach Anderson-Tauzer, MRMPO Outreach and Engagement Planner informed the committee that LUTI met last month to discuss moving into the 2045 MTP. They had a joint presentation from James, Tara, and Peach on the Land Use Model, how they forecast, and the Target Scenario for growth. James showed how changes in zoning from CABQ IDO have brought us closer to achieving the Target Scenario, which is based on the goals of more balanced jobs and housing and targeted investments in our centers and corridors. There was a discussion of scenario development for the 2045 MTP including the potential for alternative population and economic scenarios.

❖ **Intelligent Transportation Systems Subcommittee (ITS)**

Nathan Masek, MRMPO Senior Transportation Planner, informed the committee that the ITS Subcommittee met to continue to review recommendations from the Incident Management Plan completed last quarter. Additionally, the committee finalized the review of the FY24-29 TIP project proposals for consistency with the Regional ITS Architecture and in support of the federal rule "940". A summary memo was generated which included the findings of the review, along with plan maintenance-action to accommodate the inclusion of new ITS Services for advanced bicycle and pedestrian detection at intersections. Most noteworthy in this review is the fact that this process identified 33 of the over 56 projects submitted for funding to include ITS elements in their design, and thus is an indication that our local agencies are embracing advanced technologies to enhance the safety and mobility of the transportation system.

**TAB 5
R-23-07 MTB**

Amending the FFY 2020-2025 TIP (Out of Cycle TIP Amendment)

Steven Montiel, MRMPO Program Manager, informed the MTB board that the Out of Cycle TIP Amendment has received unanimous support for approval by the TPTG and the TCC.

Mr. Montiel explained that the Montgomery/I-25 Interchange project received State funding and it required some changes to other existing NMDOT projects in order to make it whole. Construction can happen in the near future, pending the approval of the Out of Cycle TIP Amendment.

Steven Montiel stood for questions.

Councilor Stuart Murray, Village of Corrales, asked by reducing the funding, and pushing the projects out, what does that do to the structural integrity of those intersections and the bridges, if they're deteriorating and we keep pushing the funds out, how does that impact the safety of those particular areas?

Mr. Montiel turned the question over to Justin Gibson and Jill Mosner from the NMDOT.

Justin Gibson, NMDOT, explained that the NMDOT has been trying to financially constrain the Montgomery project for some time. NMDOT is also looking at ways of funding the Rio Bravo, as well as the Gibson project. Both the Rio Bravo and the Gibson projects are progressing. Design will still continue on Rio Bravo and the preliminary program management will continue on Gibson.

Councilor Murray, Village of Corrales, asked in the legislative process, the NMDOT was asking for a lot of money. What is the outcome of that legislative process and was there additional funds that will be coming into the district?

Justin Gibson, NMDOT, answered yes, there were additional funds. That's going to be listed on the out-of-cycle amendment. The NMDOT did receive funding from house bill II from the 2023 legislative cycle. He also mentioned that District Three is aware of the BIL funding that's available through the FHWA. The district will be working with the FHWA office in New Mexico, to ask for a debrief so that the NMDOT can better understand how to apply for grants.

Chair Klarissa Pena, City of ABQ, informed the MPO that the board could use an amendment summary on projects so that new members have a better understanding.

Steven Montiel, MRMPO, confirmed that moving forward the MPO will provide an addendum to the amendments, to help make it easier to understand. It will be provided in June for the next third-cycle TIP amendment.

Claudia Patricia Merlo, MRMPO Transportation Planner, presented in detail the changes to the NMDOT funding that took place in order for projects to be completed. She also mentioned the new project for Rio Metro and the deletion of the Valencia County project due to TPF funding.

TAB 7 Status of TIP Development 2024-2029

Mr. Montiel gave a brief presentation on where the MPO is currently at with the FFY 2024-2029 TIP development process and presented a timeline on past and future TIP development benchmarks. Mr. Montiel mentioned a final TIP for public comment and review will be available by June of 2023. Final TIP adoption is anticipated by July 21, 2023, or August 2023 at the latest.

Steven Montiel stood for questions.

Mayor Donald Lopez, City of Los Ranchos, asked if the amount of money received is set in stone? Is there a possibility of getting more funding from the BIL or any other source?

Steven Montiel stated that the money being programmed are the formula funds that the MPO receives should be final figures for the metro area, Mr. Montiel also mentioned that there are additional opportunities for funding through national and competitive discretionary funding opportunities.

Patrick Montoya, City of ABQ, asked if the funds that were allocated for the transit department in Albuquerque, have been discussed with the transit director or staff?

Mr. Montiel stated that yes, the MPO has been working with the designated staff that's on the TPTG, as well as the transportation coordination committees and all the requests went through City Council.

There were no other questions from the board.

TAB 8 Orthophotography Presentation

Forest Replogle, MRMPO, gave a presentation on Orthophotography. Forest explained that orthophotography is digital aerial photography that has been geometrically corrected or "orthorectified". The software is useful in creating precise maps and models of the terrain. Forest showed some examples while using orthophotography and mentioned that orthophotography will be useful for member agencies and the public.

Steven Montiel encouraged the agencies that are interested in the orthophotography program to partner with the MPO for their next project.
