PUBLIC COMMENTS AND REPORTS

TAB 3

Public Comments

There were no requests from the public to address the Transportation Coordinating Committee.

Reports

❖ Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) Staff –

Steven Montiel, MRMPO Transportation Program Manager, informed the committee that the Transportation Improvement Program and the eSTIP were impacted by the new debt ceiling deal that was passed by the House and Senate regarding unobligated Covid Relief Funds. The MPO was notified by the Governor's office that the relief funds will be swept for all unobligated COVID funds.

An emergency meeting was called with the Cabinet Secretary from NMDOT, the Chairs from each committee, and the Chair of the Metropolitan Transportation Board to discuss potential solutions. NMDOT proposed a scenario to hold all projects programmed with COVID funds harmless. The State proposed that they would take the relief funds and apply that towards the debt service in return for the prior Surface Transportation Program- Large Urban obligation limitation.

Steven Montiel stood for comments and questions.

Jill Mosher, NMDOT, recommended that any funding that is a hundred percent federal should be programmed early in the TIPs/STIPS in the future. Jill also recommended that the agencies applying for funding meet the application deadlines.

Kendra Montanari, MRMPO Transportation Planning and Technical Services Manager gave an update on the following committees and ongoing work:

the MPO will be hosting a Tribal Summit. The purpose of the summit is to discuss the services that are provided at the MPO, focusing on GIS services, and discussing grant resources.

Kendra also mentioned that the MPO hosted a pedestrian design workshop with the FHWA and that they have kicked off the Regional Transportation Action Plan. In addition, the public engagement was kicked off and that will be led by Groundwork Studios. The Technical Team is convening in August and the MPO is still accepting people from member agencies, who want to be a part of the technical team and help advise that process. Lastly, Kendra informed the committee that the MPO will be a host MPO for the AMPO Planning Tools and Training Symposium, which will take place from May sixth through May ninth. The MPO will lead mobile tours, that provide the opportunity for member agencies to showcase their projects.

❖ Active Transportation Committee (ATC) –

The Active Transportation Committee met in April with a presentation from the City of Albuquerque on the Bikeway and Trail Facility Plan Update. The Non-Motorized Counts Program Study Steering Committee (which includes many Active Transportation Committee members) met in early May for a productive meeting on how to structure the future non-motorized counts program. The consultant is now taking this feedback for use in the recommendations phase of the study. The Active Transportation Committee will have its next meeting in June.

❖ **Congestion Management Process Committee (CMP) –**

The CMP met in June. The TIP project list was discussed. There was a debrief on the Project Selection process. The consensus was that it worked well. There was also a demonstration of the TAQA Tool, which is live on the MRCOG website.

❖ **Intelligent Transportation System Subcommittee (ITS) –**

Nathan Masek, MRPO Senior Transportation Planner, informed the committee that the ITS Subcommittee is continuing to identify and establish signal timing plans in support of the incident management plan for the interstate system completed last year. In addition, the ITS has been pursuing updates to the regional GIS infrastructure and they received several agency updates.

❖ **Land Use & Transportation Integration Committee (LUDI) –**

Kendra Montanari, MRMPO Transportation Planning and Technical Services Manager informed the committee that the LUDI did not meet in May because of the pedestrian Design Workshop. They will meet on June twenty-eighth and discuss the goals of the Metropolitan Transportation Plan.

❖ **Transportation Program Technical Group (TPTG) –**

Mr. Montiel informed the committee that the TPTG met last Tuesday and discussed the status update of the FFY 2023 projects. Mr. Montiel also mentioned that there is a need for By America information, such as more information on the requirements, and how that impacts local agencies. The NMDOT will be providing more details.

The inactive list was reviewed, and it was recommended that agencies with new departments that are receiving federal funds attend the Transportation Program Technical Group monthly meetings. Mr. Montiel also informed the committee that there was a mention of required training for new staff members if they have not dealt with federal funds.

The Transportation Improvement Program draft scenario was taken before the board last month and was approved to post for public comment and review. The MPO is working on newsletter announcements, the MRCOG website was updated, and there will be announcements on the MPO's social media page. This will be posted throughout June and July.

In July, the MPO will have the final TIP, which will incorporate all projects.

Claudia Patricia Merlo, MRMPO Transportation Planner, presented to the committee the amendment scenarios for the FFY 2020-2025 TIP (3rd Cycle) projects.

Steven Montiel, MRMPO Transportation Program Manager informed the committee that the MPO was notified about some unprogrammed funds that needed to go to a project that was shelf ready. At the TPTG meeting, it was decided that the funds would go to the Rio Bravo project (A300942).

Steven Montiel, MRMPO Transportation Program Manager informed the committee that the MPO has everything posted for public comment and review. The MPO will have the final comments take place from June twentieth to July twenty-first. The MPO will continue to coordinate with agencies and report any public comments.

Mr. Montiel also mentioned the MPO is assigning control numbers and MPO IDs for all the new projects. The MPO is also transferring projects from the current TIP to the new TIP. The eSTIP will be ready by late August for final adoption by the Federal Highway Administration. The new TIP will be implemented by October first of this year.

Steven Montiel stood for questions.

Richard Meadows, Bernalillo County, asked Jill Mosher about the TPF Presentation format needed for the upcoming meeting.

Jill Mosher, NMDOT, informed the committee to bring their presentations on a USB drive. Jill also mentioned keeping the presentations brief and being prepared to answer questions about the status of previously awarded TPF Projects.

15 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for each metropolitan area; and

16 WHEREAS, the Mid-Region Council of Governments (MRCOG) is the
17 designated metropolitan planning organization for the Albuquerque Metropolitan
18 Planning Area (AMPA); and

19 WHEREAS, the Mid-Region Metropolitan Planning Organization (MRMPO) is a
20 division of MRCOG responsible for the implementation of 23 CFR 450; and

21 WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Transportation Board (MTB) is governing body of
22 MRMPO; and

23 WHEREAS, *Connections 2040, the 2040 Metropolitan Transportation Plan,*
24 (2040 MTP) has been approved by the MTB and is the long-range transportation plan
25 for the AMPA; and

26 WHEREAS, the 2040 MTP provides the basis for programming projects in the

27 TIP for the AMPA; and

28 WHEREAS, the FFY 2024-2029 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) has
29 been developed based on the contents, goals and objectives of the 2040 MTP; and

30 WHEREAS, the FFY 2024-2029 TIP was developed in accordance with all
31 federal regulations (23 CFR 450) and laws; and

32 WHEREAS, the TIP must contain all federally-funded transportation projects in
33 the metropolitan transportation planning area prior to the distribution of funds to those
34 projects; and

35 WHEREAS, the TIP must contain all regionally significant projects in the
36 metropolitan transportation planning area regardless of the source of funding.

37 NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Metropolitan Transportation Board
38 of the Mid-Region Metropolitan Planning Organization, a division of the Mid-Region
39 Council of Governments of New Mexico, that

- 40 1. The FFY 2024-2029 Transportation Improvement Program as presented
41 in ATTACHMENT A is hereby approved.
- 42 2. The Executive Director of the Mid-Region Council of Governments is
43 authorized to finalize and publish the FFY 2024-2029 TIP and submit it to
44 the New Mexico Department of Transportation (NMDOT) for inclusion in
45 the State Transportation Improvement Program for transmittal to the
46 appropriate agencies in the U.S. Department of Transportation.
