Tab 5 R-21-01 MTB

Amending the FFY 2020-2025 TIP to Accommodate Various Changes

Mr. Montiel presented the TIP amendment and described each. He said that the resolution comes to the TCC without recommendation from the TPTG.

Mr. Montiel said that the TIP had been modified for project A30-849, a City of Albuquerque project, noting that no procedures have been violated by this action. The City of Albuquerque plans to add funding to make this project whole and it has come through the TIP amendment process.

Also, project A30 1032 from the City of Albuquerque Parks and Recreation was added to the TIP amendment adding local and State funding which utilizes TIP management procedures. Mr. Montiel also noted that all changes allow for fiscal constraint in the TIP as required.

Mr. Montiel then stood for questions and a lengthy discussion followed.

Jill Mosher, New Mexico Department of Transportation, said she agrees with the action of the TPTG and said that it was her understanding that the federal funds which were added to A30-849 were for hold harmless action in cutting funds and that it represents a reduction of \$32 million over the next five years in National Highway Performance Program funding.

Grant Brodehl, Rio Metro Regional Transit District (RMRTD), said that it is his belief that these reserve funds would be shared collectively and that, if this action is approved, something is broken in the process.

Mr. Gottlieb voiced his agreement with Mr. Montiel and Ms. Mosher and said that no procedures were violated. Mr. Gottlieb said he believes this issue needs to be ironed out before the next TPTG meeting.

RECOMMEND APPROVAL OF R-21-01 MTB AMENDING THE FFY 2020-2025 TIP TO ACCOMMODATE VARIOUS CHANGES

Ms. Mosher made a motion to:

MODIFY THE AMENDMENT TO EITHER ELIMINATE THE PROJECT IN QUESTION COMPLETELY OR ELIMINATE THE PROPOSED 2023 STPU FUNDS FROM A30 849 FROM THE AMENDMENT

The motion was seconded by Mr. Lopez.

A roll call vote was taken on Ms. Mosher's motion. The vote was taken. The vote was ten in favor, six opposed and four abstentions. The motion passed and became the recommended TIP amendment which will be forwarded to the MTB for final approval.

The main motion to approve R-21-01 MTB remained open and a roll call vote was taken to approve the main motion as amended.

Highway Infrastructure Programs-Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2021

Mr. Montiel presented information on the Highway Infrastructure Programs saying that the COG/MPO would receive stimulus funds for the highway improvement programs. These funds will have the same eligibility requirements as Surface Transportation Block Grant and can be used for various improvements. The funds must be obligated by the end of September 2024.

These monies are only to the large urban area and Albuquerque will receive \$8.2 million. The MPO will recommend looking at projects in the existing TIP which would be shovel ready at the appropriate time.

Mr. Montiel stood for questions.

Maria Rinaldi, Village of Los Ranchos, encouraged targeting specific projects and also asked for consideration of the Village of Los Ranchos projects for 2023.

Mr. Montiel noted that this is a discussion item only which will eventually go to the Metropolitan Transportation Board for approval.

Review of Future Revisions to the Community Engagement Committee Charter

Jacob Wolff, MRCOG Planner, briefly reviewed proposed revisions to the Community engagement Committee Charter (formerly known as the Public Involvement Committee).

Mr. Wolff noted that the purpose of the new committee is to re-visit the public engagement process as described in a document dated September 2019.
